PEACE SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

Awards of \$500 to \$700 each to be known as the Peace Scholarship will be awarded to further a student's post high school study. It is sponsored by the Brethren, Friends and Mennonite congregations of the greater Howard County area.

The following guidelines pertain to this scholarship award:

APPLICANT INFORMATION:

- 1. Applicant must be a high school senior planning to enroll in at least nine hours of undergraduate study in the fall semester.
- 2. Scholarship application forms may be obtained from high school counseling offices.
- 3. Applicant must, in addition to the application, write an essay on a peace topic.
 - Suggestions for possible topics are provided on page 3. The essay must be titled, double spaced, typed or word processed, approximately five hundred (500) words in length not to exceed eight hundred (800) words. The essay should present your topic in a clear, concise, and logical discussion to support your thoughts. Please DO NOT put your name on your essay. <u>DO NOT</u> include school names, names of individuals, churches, or businesses in your essay.
- 4. Recipient selection will be based on the merit of the essay only.

- 6. Final selection may involve a personal interview of top candidates by one or more members of the scholarship committee.
